#### Saturday 25th June

Throughout the day there will be live entertainment in the ballroom with Rachel Mercer, George Formby tribute and also Kelly Waldie. The bus stops outside Vetrano's Italian Restaurant where music and good food await you! The Lawrence Hotel, The Cellar Restaurant and the Fat Giraffe also provide excellent food and drink and are well worth a visit. Should you manage to make it half way down the hill and still haven't stopped to eat, then there are quite a few sandwich bars to snack on or wait until you reach the bottom of the hill and pop into Mooch Café. Again, well worth a visit.

Still not managed to have a bite to eat? Then go over the bridge and left up out of town. Again there are sandwich bars galore - you won't go hungry in Padiham! Whilst making your way down the hill, every participating establishment that you enter make sure you get the trail card stamped. Upon completion your card will be entered into a free draw with prizes of Business Vouchers which can be spent in participating businesses throughout the town.
